

# Glaciar Calluqueo

## ITINERARY IS PART OF PROGRAMS TO MARBLE CHAPELS

The Calluqueo Glacier is a beautiful millenary mass of ice that descends along the western slope of Mount San Lorenzo. At its base, it has a beautiful lead-colored mountain lake resulting from the large amount of sediment carried by the waters from the top of the hill. It is surrounded by pristine forests inhabited by huemules (South Andean deer) and where condors fly over.

| 17:00 hrs. | Confluence of the Baker River with the Neff River                  |
| 18:00 hrs. | Arrival at Parador Loberías del Sur or similar.                    |
